Introduction

The UNESCO Chair in Urban Landscape at the University of Montreal is looking for a person holding a doctorate degree in order to complete a 12-month postdoctoral contract. As part of this contract, the postdoctoral fellow will be required to collaborate on several intersectoral projects of the UNESCO Chair on the theme "Inclusive urban landscapes". This person will also be able to undertake their own research projects within this theme under the direction of Professor Shin Koseki, holder of the UNESCO Chair, and in collaboration with professors from the Faculty of Planning of the University of Montreal.

The UNESCO Chair in Urban Landscape at the University of Montreal develops research, teaching and knowledge transfer projects in the fields of urban design, urban planning, landscape architecture and architecture. Inspired by intersectoral approaches, it aims to bring together various expertises in design, social and human sciences as well as applied computer science.

The research activities of the UNESCO Chair in Urban Landscape are supported by the Sid Lee Architecture Fund, by the Canada Research Funds, by the Quebec Research Funds, by the Quebec Ministry of Economy and Innovation, by the city of Montreal and by the University of Montreal.

Responsibilities

As part of a intersectoral project on urban visual data collection methods, you will contribute to the development of an inclusive qualitative interview and survey protocol, as well as its implementation. You will undertake the analysis of the results with regard to the literature on social inclusion, "diversity markers", and intersectionality. On the basis of the analyses, you will take part in the production of scientific articles alongside other collaborators of the UNESCO Chair.

As part of a complementary cross-sectoral project on the fostering of feelings of inclusion in public spaces, you will contribute to the adaptation and execution of the same research protocol. You will analyze the results in the light of the same literature and write scientific articles in collaboration with the other collaborators of the UNESCO Chair.

You will be asked to organize and animate internal and external events on the theme of inclusive urban landscapes and act as a resource person for researchers in training (masters or doctorate). In collaboration with the director of the UNESCO Chair and research assistants, you will be required to define a communication, promotion and knowledge transfer strategy for the various activities carried out by the Chair on the theme of inclusive urban landscapes.

- Demonstrated scientific interest for urban issues

- Interest towards issues relating to the use of public space
- Interest in issues of "Equity, diversity and inclusion"
- Interest in methodological issues in the fields of social sciences and humanities
- Interest in intersectoral issues combining social and human sciences and applied computer science
- Ability to carry out directed research activities autonomously
- Professional command of both French and English
